Navigator

Lets you browse through several pages of the display and select a line (the bottom line is implicitly active).



Guide key

This key lets you:

- obtain information about the telephone
- program the keys



to reduce loudspeaker or receiver volume



to increase loudspeaker or receiver volume

Hands free:

to make or answer a call without lifting the receiver

Alphabetic keypad

Protected by a flap, used for call by name, message service and programming. You have a self-ad-hesive 'Memo' label to stick inside the flap.

Display and display keys

Displays 2 lines and several pages giving information on your correspondent and the functions available through the keys associated with the lines of the display screen.

Call required number.



If you do nothing, Alcatel OmniPCX Office diverts calls to your voice mailbox.




